The authors explain how to conceptualize, implement and sustain a hopeful and positive frame of mind in a daily practice, as well as how to begin conversations about how the system can respond to needed care for children and families.

Brohl, K. (2004). *New miracle workers: Overcoming contemporary challenges in child welfare work*. Washington, DC: Child Welfare League of America Press.

A compilation of information gathered from more than 100 child welfare workers to address major issues facing practitioners today, including violence, substance abuse, and obesity. Presents recent neuroscience research on the human brain and discusses how this information affects new and future child welfare practice.

The editors- together with over 70 child welfare experts offer what is known about how best to work with maltreated children and their families.
